The Century Lived

In the heart of Colombo, Sri Lanka, stands a timeless institution that has been a pillar of education for over 188 years. The Royal College is a place where tradition meets progress, and values transcend boundaries that create an unparalleled identity. It all began in 1835 when this remarkable institution first opened its doors at Hill Street in Pettah, in the back veranda of an Anglican church.

On the 10th of October 1923, it was ceremonially opened by the governor general who presided at its annual Prize Giving amidst a large gathering of the crème de la crème of the then society.

Smart School Transformation project

The successful implementation of smartboards also requires a robust and secure structured network infrastructure. This would serve as the backbone of the smarter school environment, enabling seamless connectivity and data transmission between devices, including smartboards, tablets, and other educational tools while ensuring the entire system functions smoothly and reliably with minimal disruptions to the learning process.

Plans includes establishing a teacher training centre to provide thorough training for educators on smartboard usage and related software. Additionally, ongoing support and resources will be offered to help teachers continuously enhance their digital teaching skills.

Objectives of the project include

- 1) Enhance student learning through interactive and multimedia elements in teaching
- 2) Establish a secure digital infrastructure to support educational technologies, such as smartboards
- 3) Empower teachers with digital tools for 21st-century teaching methods
- 4) Monitor and track student performance by all stakeholders for early identification of shortfalls and corrective action
- 5) Increase school management efficiency through the strategic use of technology solutions
- 6) Ensure access and inclusion for all students, regardless of their backgrounds, to benefit from the technology.

The overarching aim is to usher in a new era of learning that is not only more engaging but also highly interactive, efficient and effective.

It is estimated that around Rs. 150 million would be required to get the project, including the Smart-boards, network, and training infrastructure, off the ground. The "Century Ahead" committee invites all members of the Royal College community to come together and play their part in shaping the future of our beloved institution and its offspring. Whether through financial contributions, mentorship, or active participation, each of us has a role to play in ensuring Royal College's continued success and impact on generations to come.

The College Cadet Platoon extended a formal Guard of Honour to Vice Admiral Priyantha Perera, while the Scouts warmly welcomed him as well. The event was attended by Principal Mr. Thilak Wattuhewa and members of the staff, officials of the RCU and SDS, Old Royalists including Admiral Tisara Samarasinghe (Retd) and other distinguished Old Royalists who held apex posts in the tri-forces.

Victory Day Celebration

A ceremony was held to celebrate the Victory Day (May 19) and to commemorate fallen War Heroes. Commemoration event was held at the College War Heroes' Monument with the participation of School administration, SDS officials, RCU officials, old Royalists members of the tri-forces, ORCBA members, cadets and students.

Upkeeping of Infrastructure and Assets of the Cadet Band

A project to improve the environs of the War Heros' Monument, Cadet Square & the Lobby was carried out at a cost of Rs250,000. Moreover, over Rs125,000 was spent over the quarter for the regular upkeep of the cadet band bus, fuel, payments to driver, cleaning, washing and running repairs. A further Rs.750,000 was spent on repainting of Cadet Band Room, furniture, and upkeep of storage cupboards. Furthermore, nearly 80 musical instruments, including 30 donated by ORCBA, were serviced and repaired at a cost of Rs125,000. Additionally, each instrument was marked with serial numbers and an inventory created for maintenance.



Leadership Development Training Program for Captains & Vice Captains of Sports

The Leadership Development Training Program for Captains & Vice Captains of Sports at Royal College took place on May 19th and 20th at the MAS Athena training center in Thulhiriya. More than 40 athletes from over 15 sports participated in this two-day training camp. The event was organized by the Royal College Group of 2005, with guidance from the Royal College Loyalty Pledge Management Committee (LPMC) Sports Guild. The event's conclusion featured an awards ceremony attended by Principal Royal College Mr. R. M. M. Rathnayaka and Senior Games Master/Assistant Principal Royal College Mr. Riyaz Aluher. The project's total cost was nearly LKR 1 million.

In a milestone project, Royal College Group of ‘91 funded renovations, technology upgrades and installation of new hardware worth LKR 27 million for the ICT laboratory at Royal College. The group celebrated its members turning 50 years this year by funding one of the single, largest projects undertaken by any old boys’ group to date.

The IT lab is now fully equipped with 54 Dell i5 11th Gen desktop computers with secondary power via a 20Kv UPS, a local area network, electrical cabling and an interactive SMART board to ensure a smooth and modern digital learning experience. The the ICT laboratory was also refurbished with brand new furniture, ACs and equipment including CCTV and interior designed to look sleek and modern while maintaining the grandeur of the building. The lab was ceremoniously handed over on July 11, 2022.

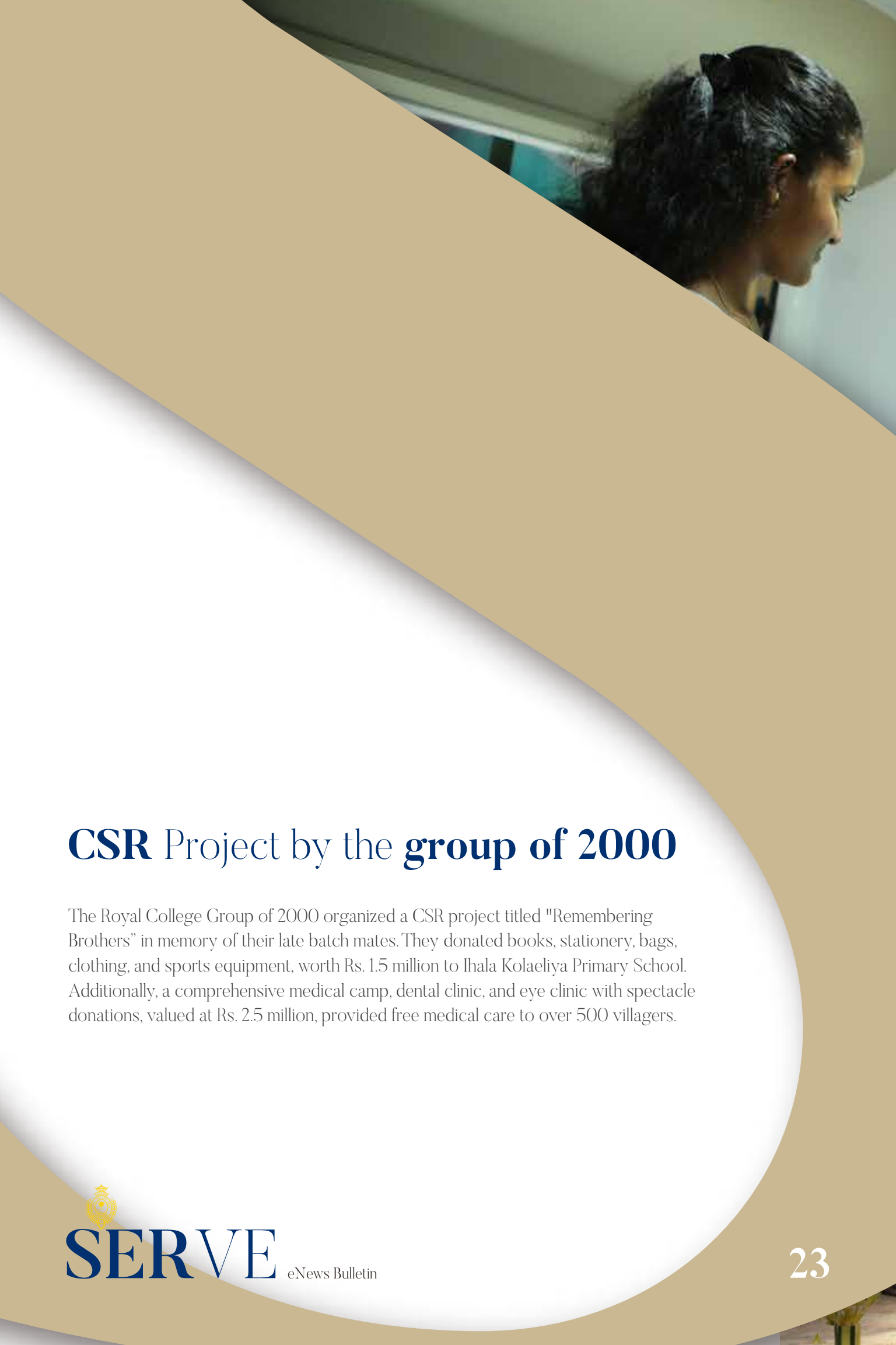
Projects by the **Wushu Advisory and Management Committee (RCWAMC)**

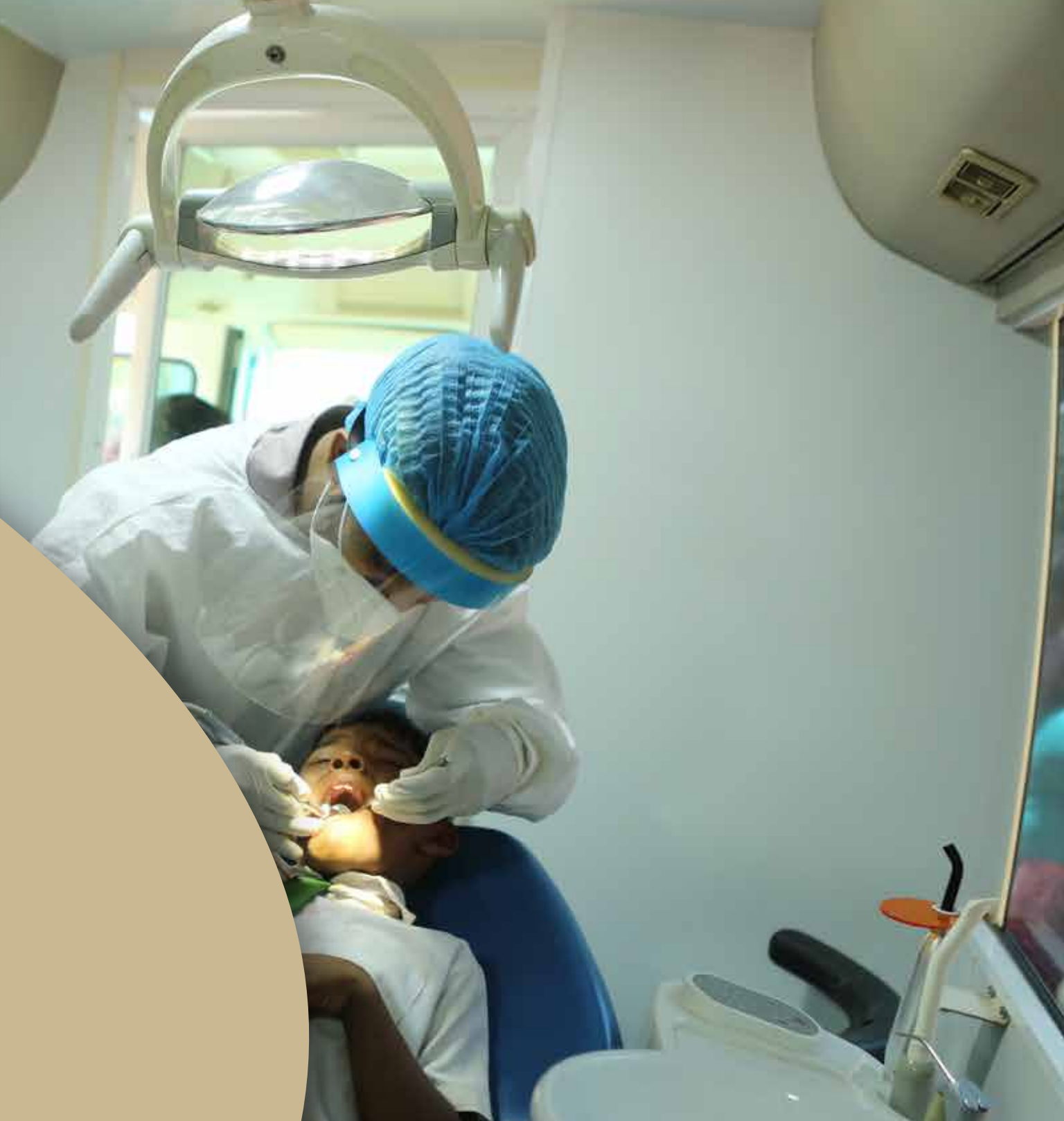
Financial Support for Sportsman
