union and contribute wit h your might, in an effort to 'Repay the Debt' we owe.





## ICT upgrade worth LKR 27 million for Royal funded by the Group of '91

RCG'91 celebrates Golden Jubilee with a bang

In a milestone project, Royal College Group of '91 funded renovations, technology upgrades and installation of new hardware worth LKR 27 million for the ICT laboratory at Royal College. The group celebrated its members turning 50 years this year by funding one of the single, largest projects undertaken by any old boys' group to date.





### Projects by the Old Royalists Social Service League

Old Royalists Social Services League funded several projects run by the Royal College School Social Services League in September 2022.







- 1. All teachers received greeting cards to celebrate the Teachers' Day
- 2. Road safety jackets were given to all stewards who maintain safety at college
- 3. O/L students in Design and Mechanical Technology received necessary material to pursue the subject
- 4. A children's home in Piliyandala was painted in time for Children's Day in October
- 5. Conducted 'Dahamata Saviya' project that included painting of a local church, followed by a religious ceremony to offer blessings, and provide meals for low-income families in the Piliyandala area.
- 6. Donated dry rations, fruits, and vegetables to an Elders' Home in the Piliyandala area.
- 7. Oganized their 37th Annual Dansela Project at Maharagama Apeksha Hospital on November 7, 2022. Along with the Dansela, they donated tables, fans, bulbs, ration packets, fruits for patients and the visitors as well as medicine to the patients. They also painted ward No. 21.
- 8. The League arranged a lunch buffet for 100 members of the school staff and students.





## Young Royalists welcomed with open arms by the Old Boys

ORGACO greets Grade 6 scholars with best wishes from several groups and individuals

The grade 6 students who were admitted to Royal College based on the highest results at the grade 5 scholarship examination were welcomed at a ceremony held on March 10, 2022. They received school uniforms and stationary packs that were funded by individual members and old boys' groups affiliated to the RCU. The total value of the donation was LKR 681,200. This was an initiative coordinated and concluded by the ORGACO.

## Grade 6 entrants receive tools to excel in their new chapter with Royal

RC Group of '06 welcomes the students to feel right at home

The group donated 260 stationary packs worth LKR 900,000 to the Grade 6 students who were admitted to Royal College based on the highest results at the grade 5 scholarship examination. A further LKR 105,000 worth of scholarships were awarded to the Grade 6 scholars who scored highest in the 2021 Scholarship Examination. Students who ranked island first and second received cash prizes along with students who ranked district first from Anuradhapura, Galle, Trincomalee, Kaluthara and Matara.







## Cricketers and ruggerites motivated by the Class of '72

Royal athletes are nurtured; their skills enhanced, and attitudes grounded. The alumni play a critical and an impactful role in guiding, supporting and motivating the young sportsmen of Royal. Two members of the Class of '72, Mr. Amal Nanayakkara, a specialist in HR Development and Dr. Anil Priyanka Beddavithana, a PhD holder from the University of Kelaniya carried out the programme that was designed to fuel the young men to stand their ground and face any challenges on the field as well as within themselves. The session took place on June 9, 2022 at the RCU Skills Center.



With the aim of combatting COVID-19 and safeguarding the students who have returned to onsite learning, the Group of 2008 installed hand sanitizer dispensers in 230 locations throughout the college. The project was completed at a cost of LKR 546,000 and included all classrooms, academic and non-academic staff rooms as well as the hostel.





### Royal celebrates 100 years of Tennis;

### Group of '96 completes P Nagendran Tennis Complex Construction

A massive US\$260,128 donation from old boy Dr. Sukumar Nagendran

Coinciding with Royal College celebrating a century of playing Tennis, the Group of '96 completed the construction of a state-of-the-art tennis court complex and handed it over to the college.

This monumental feat was a possibility on account of the Royal College Old Boys of East Coast Foundation (RCOBECA) in the USA stepping forward to fund the project through one of its active and eminent members, Dr. Sukumar Nagendran who graciously sponsored, the entire project at a cost of USD 260,128. The complex includes two all-weather, hard tennis courts. The project is a collaborative effort of the RCOBECA and the Royal College Tennis Advisory and Management Committee.

Dr Nagendran, or Dr Suku as the Group fondly calls him, was a former Tennis player and coloursman of Royal College. Today he is an accomplished physician, pharmaceutical developer and biotech executive, pioneering breakthroughs in gene therapy as President, R&D and Chief Medical Officer at Jaguar Gene therapy.

Leveraging on cutting edge technology, the virtual expo offered a futuristic experience for students to explore their educational and career choices from the comfort and safety of their homes.

The EDEX Hybrid Expo 2022 comprised of over 47 education exhibition booths, representing a mix of local and foreign universities and institutes. The Teachers' Guild of Royal College organized 'Sihinayaki Re' Television Programme on January 30, 2022 to raise funds and ORGACO heeded this request by collecting LKR 250,000 from the alumni to facilitate the programme.

## **RCUAC Challenge Shield** organized by the RCUAC

The Royal College Union Aquatic Club held the The RCUAC Challenge Sheild Water Polo tourney for the second year running at the Royal College Pool. This year's event features players from the under 11 to under 18: 25 team from 11 leading schools, including S. Thomas' College, Nalanda College, Royal College, Colombo International School, Bishop's College, Visakha Vidyalaya and Ladies' College took part in the tournement. The RCUAC's objective is to provide opportunity for the students to start the game of Water Polo at the grassroots level, the under 11s. It also provides the under 15 and 18 players to participate in competition after two years. An over 30 masters' age group category was also introduced, making this meet inclusive to a wider community. This will mark the first masters' category in a meet from RCUAC, OTSC or TAAS to ever take place in Sri Lanka. All matches were monitored by the Sri Lanka Aquatic and Sports Union (SLASU) and will be refereed by SLASU registered referees.

### **Tamarind Tree** Treated

"I'll meet you under the Tamarind tree" was a term used by the Royalists during the 1950s' to challenge each other to fight, at this location. Many hundreds of others who have frequented these playgrounds over the years to play cricket, athletics, baseball, and football, remember this as their 'pavilion'. This unique location continues to provide shade and a meeting place for Royalists of all ages.

May these two special creations of mother nature, continue to stand as landmarks of our alma mater, providing shade, shelter, and precious memories of schooldays, to many more generations of Royalists. The Group of '98 treated two tamarind trees for fungal diseases according to the instructions of the scientists of the Peradeniya Botanical Garden. The project was funded by the Group of '98 under the guidance of the School Development Society.

### Group of 2011 website launched

Celebrating their tenth anniversary, the Group of 2011 launched their official website. To commemorate the occasion, they donated essentials to 50 students of Al Hikma College, St Mary's Tamil Maha Vidyalaya and Nayakakanda Primary Girls School.

## Projects by Old Royalist Association Piliyandala

1. Rajakeeya Shilpa Yarthra 2022

The annual Rajakeeya Shilpa Yathra (RSY), GCE O/L Science Seminar was organized by Old Royalist Association Piliyandala (ORAP) on April 24, 2022 at Piliyandala Municipal Auditorium for the ninth successive year.

Endorsed by the Zonal Educational Department of Ministry of Education, this programme benefited 400 students from 20 schools in the Piliyandala Educational Zone. An entire day of knowledge exchange was carried out by two distinguished members of ORAP, who are senior teachers from leading schools in Colombo. The sessions were recorded and posted on the ORAP YouTube channel so that the students could later refresh what they learnt too. In addition, they received meals and refreshments as well.

As an annual custom, ORAP also made a donation to Royal College Past Teachers Association.

#### 2. Sisudiriya Scholarship Programme

ORAP carried out a scholarship programme for the students in the Piliyandala Educational Zone who were selected based on their merits. ORAP also contributed Rs 42,000 to the Loyalty Pledge Membership Committee (LPMC) scholarship through the Sisudiriya Programme to benefit young Royalists.

### 3. Connecting in Covid-19; data packages for LPMC Online Classes

During the pandemic, ORAP teamed up with Loyalty Pledge Management Committee (LPMC) to enable young Royalists to connect to their online classes via data packages worth LKR 60,000.

#### 4. Renovation of Piliyandala Hospital OPD Dispensary

Heeding a request by the hospital authority, ORAP carried out renovations worth LKR 300,000 to benefit the community in the area.





## **Positive Pressure Facility for ECMO unit** at NHSL by Group of '89

The Group of '89 funded a project that enabled the public to use the ECMO unit at NHSL with a total cost of LKR 6.3 million. An ECMO unit was previously only available in the Karapitiya Hospital and limited the public access to it. The former positive pressure room is now being used by at-risk patients that shouldn't be exposed to bacteria and viruses after operations.

### ORCBA hosts 'The Dinner Under the Stars'

Cadet Band Bus and 25 music instruments worth Rs. 11 million donated to school

Old Royalists' Cadet Band Association (ORCBA) hosted their annual dinner themed 'The Dinner Under the Stars' on August 28, 2022 at the college premises.

The Cadet Band Bus worth LKR 8 million and 25 music instruments worth LKR 3 million were also donated to the College during this event.

In line with the War Heroes Commemoration falling on the May 19 ORCBA and its members held the War Heroes Commemoration at College's War Monument. This ceremony celebrated 49 Royalists who sacrificed their lives in safeguarding the sovereignty and territorial integrity of our motherland.

## **Health Screening Programs** for Academic and non-academic staff and Hostellers

#### Annual Teachers' Medical Screening Programme

The Royal College Doctors' Association and the Royal College Past Teachers' Association jointly organized the Annual Teachers' Medical Screening Programme on March 6th, 2022, for the 22nd consecutive year at Nawarangahala premises. The clinic aimed to promote the health and well-being of both present and past teachers, as well as their spouses. A total of 400 teachers from both past and present were able to benefit from this program.

The screening included comprehensive medical evaluations, as well as tests for various diseases and conditions such as blood pressure, diabetes, and cholesterol levels. Teachers who were identified to have any medical conditions were referred to the relevant specialists for further evaluation and treatment.

#### Health Screening Program for Hostellers

The annual Health Screening Program for Hostellers was organized by the Royal College Doctors' Association in collaboration with the Hostel staff and under the guidance of the school administration. The program was held on 9th of October 2022 at the hostel premises. More than 250 hostelers were screened by the team of 42 doctors and 17 medical students who were present at the event.

During the screening, the doctors identified thirty-four students who were found to have malnutrition. In addition, over 90 students received treatment for dental problems, while vision testing and eye examinations were conducted for those in need.

The program was a huge success, and the students were grateful for the opportunity to receive such comprehensive healthcare services.



#### Annual Health Screening Program for Non-Academic staff

The Royal College Doctors' Association also carried out the annual Health Screening Program for Non-Academic staff, in collaboration with the Interact club. The screening was conducted on the 22nd of September 2022, at the Western Lobby of the college.

More than 75 staff members participated in the screening process. The health screening included basic health assessments, such as blood pressure, blood sugar, and body mass index measurements, as well as medical and surgical assessments. The staff members who were found to have medical and surgical conditions were referred to the relevant specialists for further management and follow-up. "I'll meet you under the Tamarind tree" was a term used by the Royalists during the 1950s' to challenge each other to fight, at this location. Many hundreds of others who have frequented these playgrounds over the years to play cricket, athletics, baseball, and football, remember this as their 'pavilion'. This unique location continues to provide shade and a meeting place for Royalists of all ages.

May these two special creations of mother nature, continue to stand as landmarks of our alma mater, providing shade, shelter, and precious memories of schooldays, to many more generations of Royalists. The Group of '98 treated two tamarind trees for fungal diseases according to the instructions of the scientists of the Peradeniya Botanical Garden. The project was funded by the Group of '98 under the guidance of the School Development Society.





## **Healthy Royal Smile 2022**

TThe "Healthy Royal Smile" project was initiated in 2014 in line with the "save molar project" launched by the Ministry of Health. The project aims to provide dental care for Royal College students who are at a high risk for dental caries.

In 2022, the project was organized for the seventh consecutive year by the Royal College Doctors' Association. A large focus was on grade 2 where 305 students of the grade were screened, and 82 students in high risk for dental caries were enrolled for further treatment in phase 2. Around 100 students receive treatment annually under this program approximately valued at around Rs. 2 million.





### Renovations to the Scout Room

The fire that engulfed the Scout Room on the 10th of October 2022, caused significant damage. Sri Lanka Navy and the Royal College Old Boys of East Coast Foundation USA (ROCOBECF) came forward to renovate the Scout Room.

With the support extended by the Chief of Staff, Rear Admiral Priyantha Perera, Royal College was able to obtain the services of Navy electrical engineers and civil engineers to estimate the budget for the renovation. Mr. Senaka Seneviratne, an old scout from ROCOBECF, along with its membership and the generous contribution from Dr. Suku Nagendran, came forward and donated Rs. 2 million for the renovation.

In addition to the financial contribution by ROCOBECF, ACL Cables and Robbialac donated cables and paint while the renovations were carried out free of charge by the Sri Lanka Navy. The renovation work was completed and the renovated room was ceremoniously handed back to the Scouts on the 12th of November 2022.

The ceremony was graced by Vice Admiral Nishantha Ulugetenna, Commander of the Sri Lanka Navy, as the Chief Guest, while Dr. Suku Nagendran was the Guest of Honour. Rear Admiral Priyantha Perera and four past presidents of ROCOBECF were also present at the ceremony.

## **Urgent repairs and termite treatment** to the Main College Building

The main college building of Royal College, which will celebrate its centenary in 2024, was in need of urgent repairs. The Ministry of Education approved a budget of Rs. 19 million for the repairs, and the Sri Lanka Navy contributed manpower with a team of experienced engineers, technicians, and construction personnel to carry out the repairs, the value of which was estimated at over Rs. 15 million.

The building was also faced the issue of termite infestation causing much damage to the woodwork in the college hall. Considering the urgency of the situation, the RCU Trust decided to fund the entire cost of the anti-termite treatment, which amounted to Rs. 4.5 million.

The treatment was carried out by a leading pest control, and the work was completed successfully within the scheduled time frame.

The main college building is a historic landmark and a symbol of pride for all Royalists, and the urgent repairs will ensure its preservation for future generations.

## Win the World with English Program

The Royal College Union Skills Centre (RCU Skills Centre) partnered with the Royal College Old Boys' Association in North America (RCOBANA) to conduct the "Win the World with English" program for the seventh consecutive year. The program has been a success in the past, with many students benefiting from it and improving their communication skills along with personality development.

The program kicked off in January 2023, with dignitaries from RCOBANA and school authorities gracing the occasion. The program is expected to help over a hundred students each year

## **Opening of the**Innovation Laboratory

A fully equipped Innovation Laboratory for STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) education at Royal College, Colombo was developed through a collaborative effort between the Sri Lanka Institute of Information Technology (SLIIT) and the ICT Advisory and Management Committee. The laboratory was inaugurated on December 5th, 2022, in a special ceremony graced by Prof. Nimal Rajapakse, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor of SLIIT.

The laboratory is expected to enhance the learning experience of Royal College students helping them to develop a range of skills and competencies necessary to excel in the rapidly evolving global job market.

# **Swimming Pool** facilities and upgrades

#### Lane Roles and spools

The group of 2007 donated six anti-wave lane ropes worth over Rs.700,000 to the swimming pool in October 2022, greatly enhancing the quality of swimming training for the students. These lane ropes are essential for competitive swimming and provide a better swimming experience by reducing water turbulence and providing clear lane separation.

New stainless-steel spools necessary to store these lane ropes were also delivered and fitted in December. Biomed International fabricated the stainless-steel spools at cost. The addition of these spools not only provided a safe and convenient way to store the lane ropes but also helped to preserve the longevity of the ropes, ensuring that they can be used by future generations of swimmers.

#### Baby pool renovation

The renovation of the baby pool was a much-needed project to ensure the safety and enjoyment of the young swimmers at the pool. The pool had suffered significant wear and tear, with damaged tiles and unsightly grouting, which not only posed a risk to the children but also detracted from the overall aesthetic appeal of the pool.

Thanks to the generous support of Blue Water Systems, the renovation was completed at a fraction of the estimated cost thanks to free manpower and equipment to carry out the necessary work.

## Renovation of Roofs of

### Grade 1 Class Rooms

The Group of 2004 repaired the Grade One at a total cost of Rs 2.0 million. The project was made possible with the generous contributions of several benefactors. The rectification work was carried out to ensure the safety and comfort of the Grade One students while preventing water leaks during the rainy season. Coordinating members of the group supervised the work closely to ensure that the rectification work was carried out according to the required standards.

## CSR Project by Group of 2000

School necessities, which included books, stationeries, school bags, shoes, clothes, and sports equipment worth Rs 1.3 million was donated to the Ihala Kolaeliya Primary School in the Puttalam District.

Additionally, doctors from the Group of 2000, and Royal College Doctors Association and Sri Lanka Saukyadana Movement, held a comprehensive medical camp

The Royal College Merchandise Shop also contributed to the project with a donation of several apparel items for the students.

The Australian brotherhood of the Group of 2000 also presented a scholarship worth Rs 250,000 was also presented to the children of their batchmates who had recently departed.

Principal of Royal College, and the Puttalam Zonal Education Office Deputy Director also participated at the event.

## Royal Aquatic Academy

The Royal Aquatic Academy was inaugurated with the focus on building a strong foundation for swimmers to enter the College swimming team in the future.

An under 13 water polo coaching program was also conducted. The aim is to continue the program in the upcoming months.

The revenue generated by the academy will be utilized towards the development of all three aquatic sports in the future.

## **Tennis Academy**

The Royal College Union Tennis Club launched the Tennis 10s Programme in December 2022. at the P. Nagendran Tennis Complex free of charge in three age categories as Orange Ball, Red Ball and Green Ball; for students between Grades 1 to 5.

The Tennis 10s Programme is conducted by Synergy Tennis headed by National Tennis Coach Renouk Wijemanne with the aim of identifying talented students at an early age and preparing them to join the College Tennis Team.

### **Band Room Renovation**

The Old Royalists' Cadet Band Association undertook the project to renovate and improve the band room and Cadets' Square in 2022. The project involved spray painting all store racks, wooden cupboards, staircases, and the entire iron mesh covers in the Cadets' Square. Two new iron cupboards were also built to store all extra instruments. The walls inside the band room and the Cadets' Square were colour washed to give them a fresh look.

To further enhance the beauty of the Cadets' Square, the old plants were uprooted and replaced with new ones in the concrete flower troughs. The lawn around the war monument was mowed, bushes were trimmed, and the entire monument garden was cleaned. All white bricks around the garden and walking path to the monument were colour washed to give a brand new look. The hostellers now have a brand-new music room after 10 years.

## **Bus for the Royal College Cadet Band**

On the 28th of August 2022, the Old Royalists' Cadet Band Association donated a custom-made exclusive bus worth Rs 8 million to the Royal College Cadet Band.

The bus was designed specifically to cater to the needs of the Royal College Cadet Band. It features 25 comfortable seats, air conditioning, fans, a TV, and a state-of-the-art 4-way speaker system. The bus also has a modern lighting system that will provide a comfortable and well-lit environment for the band members. Additionally, the bus has built-in storage space to store band equipment, ensuring that everything is kept safe and secure during transport.

The bus was fully modified to meet the specific needs of the Royal College Cadet Band. Apart from the Cadet band, the bus will also help address the growing transportation needs of various student groups, clubs, societies, and teams. The bus is expected to provide students with comfortable and safe transportation for various events and competitions. The bus will be maintained by "Auto Miraj" to ensure that it remains in top condition and can be used for years to come.



# War Monument and War Heroes Commemoration

A solemn ceremony was organized for the War Heroes Commemoration on the 19th of May. The event was held to pay tribute to the brave 49 Royalists who had made the supreme sacrifice in safeguarding the sovereignty and territorial integrity of our motherland. The commemoration ceremony was attended by a large number of Royalists, including past and present members of the cadet band. The ceremony began with the lighting of the traditional oil lamp, followed by a two-minute silence to pay respects to the fallen heroes. A special wreath-laying ceremony was also held, and members of the cadet band played the Last Post to honour the fallen heroes. The event concluded with a moving rendition of the national anthem by the cadet band, leaving everyone present with a sense of pride and patriotism.

## Exemplary spirit of giving

Several projects, both one-off as well as ongoing have been undertaken and completed by Mr. Chandimal Fernando, an exemplary benefactor and Old Royalist. He is also the Patron and Founder President of the Old Royalists' Cadet Band Association. He has made significant contributions to some of the projects mentioned herein including:

The Band room renovation project which he personally supervised and funded almost the entire project which was estimated to cost Rs. 550,000/-.

The bus the Royal College Cadets, was also fully funded by Mr. Fernando. He also renovated the music room of the Royal College Hostel and restored the musical instruments to working order and replaced new ones for the unserviceable ones at an expense of Rs.600,000/=. Instruments which the hostel did not have were bought and a sound set up was also fixed.

In addition to the above, Mr. Fernando has also been maintaining the war Monument, the garden around it, the Cadet's Square and the west wing lobby at his own expense on an ongoing basis. He has been incurring an expense of about Rs.50,000/- monthly, which includes salaries for 3 workers, plants, fertilizer, repairs, replacing of blubs and painting. His unwavering support has resulted in the monument and the garden around it becoming a symbol of pride for the college, and a testament to the sacrifices made by those who laid down their lives for the country.
