


40KW Solar Power System at the

Each hosteller receives LKR 7,500 monthly, representing an annual investment of LKR 2.43 million. Launched in 2023 with 10 hostellers, the initiative has grown through the generosity of past hostellers, overseas Royalists, and the wider Royal Brotherhood. A formal SOP now ensures transparency, with hostellers' progress monitored quarterly and shared with donors. The highlight of the year was the Scholarship Awarding Ceremony on 17th August 2025, attended by the Principal, ROCOHA President, donors, and committee members, reaffirming ROCOHA's pledge to "Flourishing Teens, Create Future."

Cybots 2025: OREPA empowers Next Generation of Robotics Innovators

The Old Royalists Engineering Professionals' Association (OREPA), in collaboration with the Royal College Computer Society, successfully hosted Cybots 2025—a dynamic series of robotics workshops and a culminating competition designed to inspire and nurture young Royalists with a passion for robotics and innovation. This initiative was conducted as part of the "Tesseract 25" project, with sessions held online from March 4 to March 28, 2025.

The Cybots curriculum was thoughtfully designed to bridge the gap between traditional school education and entry-level robotics engineering. Participants were introduced to the fundamentals of robotics and Arduino-based programming, progressing to advanced concepts in robot design. The program concluded with a hands-on design competition, allowing students to put theory into practice.

More than 50 enthusiastic students participated in the program, presenting 17 innovative

projects that demonstrated exceptional creativity and technical prowess. The creators of the top three projects were recognized for their achievements and awarded ESP and Arduino development boards, encouraging them to continue their journey in robotics and engineering innovation.
